MINUTES OF SPRING MEETING 1988

THE SPRING MEETING OF REGION 15 WAS CALLED TO ORDER APRIL 22, 1988 IN MONROVIA CALIFORNIA BY REGIONAL VICE PRESIDENT, RALPH STRANE, AT 6:45 PM. THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING AS PRESENTED IN THE 1988 SPRING NEWSLETTER, WERE APPROVED.

IN THE ABSENCE OF THE TREASURER, THE RVP READ THE TREASURER'S REPORT WHICH SHOWED A BALANCE ON HAND OF \$6439.04. LAVERNE AND RALPH CONRAD, AUDITORS, STATED THAT THEY HAD EXAMINED THE REPORT AND FOUND IT TO BE CORRECT. BILL RHINHART MOVED THE AUDITOR'S REPORT BE ACCEPTED. MOTION CARRIED.

REGIONAL JUDGES TRAINING CHAIRMAN, RALPH CONRAD, REPORTED ON THE NEWLY APPOINTED APPRENTICE JUDGES AND THE APPOINTMENT OF LOCAL SOCIETY JUDGES TRAINING COMMITTEE MEMBERS. THESE WILL ASSIST LOCAL MEMBERS WITH THEIR TRAINING.

BILL RHINHART ASKED THE APPROVAL OF \$43.00 IN ADDITION TO THE ALLOTTED AMOUNT FOR PACKING AND SHIPPING OF THE REGIONAL IRISES PURCHASED FOR THE 1990 TREK. RALPH CONFAD MOVED TO APPROVE THE ALLOCATION. MOTION CARRIED.

VALERA CHENOWETH QUESTIONED THE ABSENCE OF NON-BEARDED IRISES ON THE LIST AND AFTER SOME DISCUSSION DICK CHERRY MOVED THAT \$150.00 BE ALLOCATED FOR THE PURCHASE OF IRISES OTHER THAN TALL BEARDED FOR THE 1990 TREK. MOTION CARRIED.

A DISCUSSION FOLLOWED OF THE WAYS AND MEANS OF ATTRACTING MORE YOUTH MEMBERS.

THE MEETING WAS ADJOURNED AT 7:25 PM.

NEW SOCIETY ORGANIZED

FOR MANY YEARS THE HI-DESERT REGION OF CALIFORNIA HAS BEEN OUT OF THE MAIN STREAM AS FAR AS IRIS ACTIVITIES ARE CONCERNED. NONE OF OUR GARDENS HAVE BEEN ON A TREK AND FEW JUDGES HAVE VENTURED INTO THE AREA TO LOOK AT OUR SEEDLINGS. BUT TIMES HAVE CHANGED, AND THIS AREA IS NOW ONE OF THE FASTEST GROWING AREAS IN THE STATE. PALMDALE HAS GROWN FROM 10,000 TO 45,000 PEOPLE IN THREE YEARS WHILE NEAR BY LANCASTER HAS GROWN FROM 45,000 TO 75,000 IN THE SAME PERIOD. A NEW CLUB TO SERVE THE AREA SEEMED TO BE A NECESSITY.

CAL BOSTWICK AND BEULAH ROBINSON GOT TOGETHER TO ORGANIZE THE NEW CLUB. BOTH ARE LONG TIME MEMBERS OF AIS AND HAVE BEEN ACTIVE IN SEVERAL CLUBS BEFORE ORGANIZING THIS NEW ONE. IN MAY OVER 40 PEOPLE ATTENDED AN ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING AND THE HI-DESERT IRIS & DAYLILY SOCIETY WAS FORMED. SINCE THEN IT HAS GROWN TO 67 ACTIVE MEMBERS FROM ALL OVER THE HI-DESERT AREA.

IN JULY, AIS REGION 15 RVP, RALPH STRANE, INSTALLED THE NEW OFFICERS. THEY ARE:

REGION 15 MEMBERS RESPONDED MAGNIFICENTLY TO THE CALL FOR HELP IN GETTING THE CLUB ON ITS FEET. THE FIRST PLANT SALE HAS BEEN HELD TO GET OPERATING MONEY IN THE TREASURY. DONATIONS OF PLANTS FROM VARIOUS REGION 15 MEMBERS MADE THIS POSSIBLE. DON CUNNINGHAM AND PETE DE SANTIS EVEN HELPED WITH THE ACTUAL SELLING. WE WILL ALWAYS BE GRATEFUL FOR THIS SUPPORT.

The club is now conducting a drive to get as many of its members to join AIS as possible and is looking forward to soon becoming an affiliated club in Region 15.

REGION 15 TO HAVE A GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY BY RALPH CONRAD

Two years hence, come March 9, our Region 15 Iris Society celebrated its Golden Anniversary and at Least some thinking on how to celebrate the event is probably on the back burner or soon to be, Time to dig at the roots should be in order.

A REVIEW OF THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA IRIS SOCIETY'S BULLETIN No. 1 READS THAT IT WAS ORGANIZED "FOR THE BENEFIT OR IRIS AND IRID LOVERS" THAT'S RIGHT, "AND IRID".

LENA M. LOTHROP (REGION 15'S FIRST RVP) PRESIDED, AND J.N.GIRIDLIAN WAS SELECTED AS PRESIDENT. "OLD TIMERS" WILL REMEMBER JIM'S EXOTIC PLANT GARDEN IN ARCADIA ON FOOTHILL BLVD. (THAT GARDEN, AND ALSO THE MILIKEN IRIS GARDEN WERE BLOTTED OUT IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE FOOTHILL FREEWAY) IT SEEMS REASONABLE TO PRESUME THAT THE INCLUSION OF IRIDS WAS DUE TO THE EXOTIC LIST HE RAISED AND SOLD.

MEETING NUMBER TWO CAME SOON AFTER, ON MARCH 20, AND WAS HELD IN REDLANDS IN A MEMBERS GARDEN FOLLOWING A VISIT TO CLARENCE WHITE'S GARDEN TO INSPECT HIS ONCOCYCLUS SEEDLINGS. AT THIS MEETING THE NAME SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA IRIS SOCIETY WAS ADOPTED AND "ANNUAL DUES WERE SET AT 500 PER CAPITA." THIS MEMBERSHIP STIPEND WAS TO REMAIN UNTIL 1948 WHEN IT WAS RAISED TO COVER AN EXPANDED IRIS NOTE NEWSLETTER. THERE WERE PERIODS IN BETWEEN WHEN DUES WERE HIGHER, BUT THIS INCREASE WAS TO COVER THE COST OF AN ANNUAL PUBLICATION, WHICH APPEARS TO HAVE NEVER SURFACED, DESPITE MANY ATTEMPTS TO GET IT UNDERWAY.

THE FOLLOWING JUNE FOUND THE SOCIETY, HAVING A "GENERAL MEETING HELD IN THE PRESIDENT'S GARDEN. FOR THE FOLLOWING TWO YEARS AT, LEAST, MEETINGS WERE HELD IN VARIOUS LOCATIONS TO "COVER ALL OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA."

IN OCTOBER THE GROUP MET AT THE JUNIOR COLLEGE IN SAN BERNARDINO AT WHICH TIME THE BYLAWS WERE ADOPTED. BOTH IRIS AND IRIDS WERE PROGRAM SUBJECTS. DUES WERE MAINTAINED AT 500 PER ANNUM BUT A SPECIAL CATAGORY OF SUSTAINING MEMBER AT \$5.00 A YEAR WAS ENCOURAGED.

The san Fernando Valley was locale for the January, 1941, meeting at the La Junta del Encino, 17000 Ventura Blvd. 56 members were present. It was decided that each meeting should be held in a different section of Southern California in order that "each locality might have a part in the preparation of an interesting program devoted to Irids, that more people in the different vicinities might be interested, and that all members might have convenient meeting places available to them at sometime."

APRIL, 1941 MEETING BACK IN REDLANDS, THE SOCIETY'S SECRETARY REPORTED THE FIRST HOLLYWOOD GARDEN CLUB IRIS SHOW A GREAT SUCCESS, "ATTENDANCE TWICE THE SIZE OF THE PREVIOUS YEAR IN SPITE OF A 250 ADMISSION FEE."

JUNE OF THAT YEAR THE YOUNG SOCIETY MET AT THE WISTERIA VINE GARDENS IN SIERRA MADRE. THE PRESIDENT, MR. GIRIDLIAN, SUGGESTED THAT "WE HAVE 'IN-BETWEEN' MEETINGS IN THE FORM OF SPECIAL TOURS, CARD PARTIES, OR PICNICS WHEN FLOWERS ARE INTERESTING, AND IN THIS MANNER MAKE FURTHER AQUAINTANCE OF THE MEMBERS OF THIS FINE GROUP."

Apditional notes reminded members of the decision at the previous meeting to hold a plant sale, the proceeds to "benefit our organization." And, another reminder that "DUES ARE IN ORDER...only 50¢ a year. You may mail them to our treasurer, Mr. Fred E. Taylor or give them to him personally at the meeting. And, if possible, do enroll some, or at least one Sustaining Member at \$5.00 per annum."

HERE, THE THREE PAGE MATERIAL ENDS. IT'S A MONTH AND A HALF UNTIL "THE DAY THAT WILL LIVE IN INFAMY," THE ATTACK ON PEAR HARBOR, THE START OF WORLD WAR II FOR US.

COPIOUS NOTES BY SCIS SECRETARY, GRACE MERTENSEN DURING EARLY WWZ LEAVE MUCH TO THE IMAGINATION. A.J. (ARCHIE) MCLEAN (OWEN) WAS NOT ONLY AN OFFICER BUT DEEPLY INVOLVED WITH THE ORGANIZATION. (IHAVE IN MIND THAT ARCHIE, MARION WALKER AND POSSIBLY LURA ROACH WERE CHARTER MEMBERS AND ARE STILL TREASURER'S REPORTS SEEMED NEVER TO REACH BALANCE, GROUP GARDEN VISITS BY DIFFICULT IF NOT IMPOSSIBLE WITH GASOLINE RATIONING. I'M VAGUE ABOUT THIS PERIOD DUE TO CIRCUMSTANCES OF WARTIME, BUT SCIS BECAME AN UMBRELLA SOCIETY TO LOCAL SITUATIONS, SORT OF A MINI REGIONAL VICE PRESIDENTS WHOSE DISTRICTS WERE LISTED AS GREATER LOS ANGELES, SAN BERNARDINO-RIVERSIDE COUNTY, SAN FERNANDO VALLEY, SAN GABRIEL VALLEY, SANTA BARBARA-VENTURA COUNTIES AND EVEN NORTH SAN DIEGO COUNTY AND SOUTH SAN DIEGO COUNTY (WE WERE DIVIDED EVEN THEN!) THESE WERE CHANGED TO DISTRICT DIRECTORS AT A LATER DATE.

DRIVING DIRECTIONS FOR MEETINGS SOMETIMES INCLUDED "VIA PACIFIC ELECTRIC" AND WALKING SITUATION FROM THE NEAREST PASSENGER STOP, BRINGING MEMORIES OF THAT MAGNIFICENT SUBURBAN RAIL SYSTEM THAT WAS LATER ABANDONED IN FAVOR OF GASOLINE AND DIESEL POWERED BUSSES.



To come were acceptance of the American Iris Society as the "umbrella", Arizona becoming part of Region 15, split off from New Mexico, A.I.S. turning from a tall Bearded Society (a minor revolution) to include sections whose initial growth was slow but persistent. Region 15 members were to play important parts in this drama and included Eric Nies, Ben Hager, Carl Milliken, Clarence White, Marion Walker and others perhaps less influential. At the very least, this region was a most important command post in that battle.

SPECIFICS OF THESE DIFFICULT YEARS WOULD BE A SEQUAL TO THIS PIECE AND SHOULD INCLUDE REASONS FOR ARIDS TAKING SUCH A BACK SEAT.


