Bobbie Shepard called the meeting to order at 3:30 PM.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the *Newsletter*. Treasurer Cal Bostwick handed out printed copies of the treasurer's report. [The complete treasurer's reports for both October and January are printed on page 15 of this Newsletter.] The Treasurer's report was accepted as printed. After a discussion on how to earn a better return on Region 15 money, and following Cal's recommendation, Jeanne Plank moved, Bill Rinehart seconded that for the present, no change be made in the way region funds are managed.
